<u>TOURS IN PUGLIA</u>



ALBEROBELLO

Tourists come to Alberobello from all over the world to see its **unique urban landscape**. The town has become famous internationally because of its **"Trulli"**, **cone shaped houses** constructed in stone blocks known as chiancole.

Alberobello is **sited on two hills**, divided by a river. The **Western hill** is the oldest part of the town and here the largest number of Trulli can be found.

The old town is divided into two districts, **Aia piccola** and **Monti**, which are of national importance and have been granted special status by U.N.E.S.C.O. Profuse greenery, **olive and almond trees** cover the hillsides. Craft industry is particularly important, with all types of **traditional products** being made.

Not to be missed: the **itinerant market**, held every Thursday morning and the Saturday afternoon market, held in the Coreggia district. On Wednesday and Saturday evenings the town's butchers organise the **Fornello pronto**, a delicious barbecue. The celebrations for the **Patron Saints Medici Cosma and Damiano** are well worth attending.

It's a beautiful place for a romantic honeymoon and for an interesting tour.



OSTUNI

Ostuni was known historically as "White City" because of its small white houses, typical of Mediterranean architecture. The city is situated on the coast of the Murgia.

In the **historic center of Ostuni**, and especially in the Terra quarter, there are buildings of architectural importance: the Church of St Maria Maddelena, **Palazzo Ducale**, the Guglia di St Oronzo, the Sanctuaries of St Oronzo and St Biagio, the Church of the Annunziata, the **Cathedral of Ostuni** with the **Bastions of Aragon**.

The **Lardagnano quarter** and the **St Angelo Grotta** are also worth visiting. Ostuni is the second most important center after Brindisi.

The economy is based on the production of **textiles**, **wood**, and building materials. There are also industries connected to the tourism and the numerous **bathing establishments**.

Ostuni is really a beautiful place to stay for a romantic honeymoon and it's nice to reach with a convertible classic car during a tour.



LECCE

Lecce is the **capital of the Salento** because of its geographical position in a the region looks out over both the Ionic and Adriatic Seas. Known as **"the Florence of Baroque"**, Lecce has a wealth of architectural **monuments in Baroque style**, with gargles, portals and monuments made from **Pietra Leccese**, an easily crafted gold colored stone.

There are number of sites which will interest art enthusiasts, such as the **Church of St Croce**, Piazza St Oronzo, the Column of St Oronzo, Porta Napoli, **Lecce Cathedral**, the Mazzini district. Then there is the **Roman Amphitheatre**, The Greek Amphitheatre, the Obelisk, **Palazzo Celestini**, Palazzo Carafa, the Church of St Matteo, the **Carlo V Castle**, the Teatini Church, Piazza Duomo.

The **unusual red colored soil**, typical of this area, can be seen in the **surrounding countryside**. The cultural life of the city encompasses all fields from music to theatr, not to mention the numerous activities of the University. Lecce offers visitors the chance to glimpse **ancient history in a dynamic modern context**.

OTRANTO

Visitors to **Otranto**, one of the **Salento's most popular tourist destinations**, cannot fail but be struck by the city's strikingly beautiful **Romanesque Cathedral**. **Erected in 1088** - following the conquest by the **Normans** - it is the **largest of all <u>Puglia</u>'s churches**: 54 meters long and 25 meters wide.

In memory of the ferocious attack inflicted on the city in 1480 by the Turks, under the guide of Solomon the Magnificent, numerous **relics of its martyrs** were conserved within the cathedral and can still be seen today in the **Martyrs Chapel**, where the bones and skeletons of some 800 victims are conserved in glass shrines.

On the facade of the cathedral there is an immense **Gothic-Arabian style rose window** dating back to the renaissance period. Perhaps the most impressive features found within the cathedral are the intricately **carved capitals** depicting eagles with outspread wings, heraldic birds, and lions.

It's a very nice place to reach during a tour with a vintage car, very romantic for an honeymoon too.
